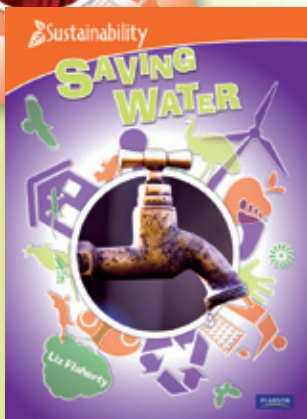
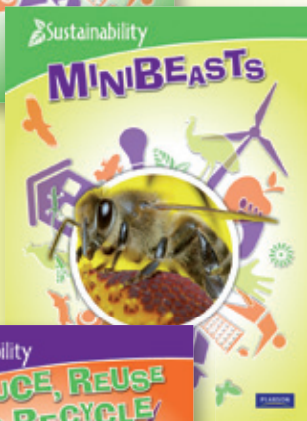
We're constantly being told we must live sustainably, but what does that mean?
